In our vacation travels we attended a church of people committed to a Christian ministry to the poor. It was more than a commitment to serve but a commitment to share their lives with these people. Many of the members had bought homes and lived in what was called a slum area. That is a commitment of courage that I admire. However, this church has been in this area for two decades, and yet no one from the community comes to their church services.

I look at this with concern because it seems somewhat like our situation. We have had several visitors from the community but no one has shown any serious interest in being part of our worship community. Will it still be his way after twenty years? It this appens, do we just make an excuse for why it is so? Or perhaps we need to look at this with repentance in our hearts. This is not just a Mennonite problem. The Baptist church in this area is providing a large amount of very valuable services to this community, and yet the pastor told me they hardly attract anyone to their worship services.

Maybe it has to do with being needed. We can't get it out of our heads that these people need our management skills, our fix-it skills, our advice, and our money. We don't sense that we need anything from these people. We humans are pretty good at sifting out what people say and what they mean. We keep saying we learn more about true spirituality from difficult experiences, but we generally don't value the understanding of those whose lives are difficult. May it be that the humility that Jesus, Peter and James oke about has something to do with Tistening to those whom the world considers unsuccessful.




